IDENTIFYING COMPONENTS AND FEATURES

The BT600HD tool is battery operated and generates a low-frequency magnetic field to activate tyre sensors. It receives UHF radio signals from the tyre sensors typically at 434MHz.



CHARGING TOOL

The BT600HD is shipped with a charged battery. It is recommended that the tool is charged 2+ hours before first use. For optimum performance, always keep it sufficiently charged.

The BT600HD will indicate when the battery has low power, and the battery icon will change color from white to red. When there is an insufficient amount of power remaining in the battery, the BT600HD will save all of the TPM Data and then power itself off.

Only use the power supply or USB cable that is included in the BT600HD tool kit to charge this tool. The use of unapproved power supplies may damage it and will void the tool warranty.

POWER ON/OFF SEQUENCE

Press and hold the power button for two seconds to power on the tool. To power off the tool, press and hold the power button for three seconds.

Auto power off is after 10 minutes of inactivity. This can be changed in the Settings menu.

The unit automatically powers up when the charger or USB port is in use – auto power off is not operational. The tool cannot be operated when plugged in.

REGISTRATION

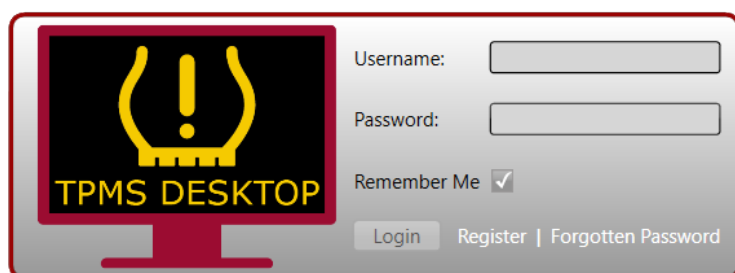
Registration enables the notification and download of software updates to the tool.
When first powered on, the tool will display the following screen:



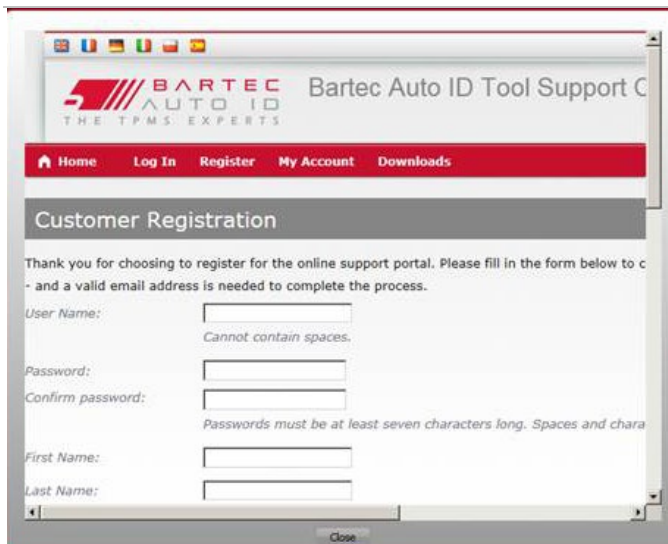
To register the tool, navigate to the Bartec TPMS Desktop website at tpmsdesktop.eu on a PC.



Download the TPMS Desktop software, and then install it using 'setup.exe'. When the TPMS Desktop has been loaded for the first time, the following screen will be displayed:



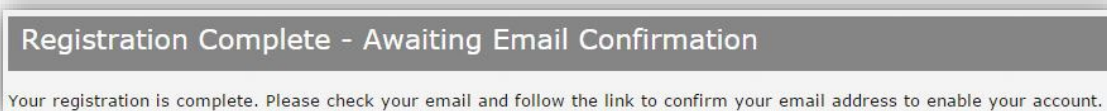
Select 'Register' to create a new account. The following screen will be displayed:

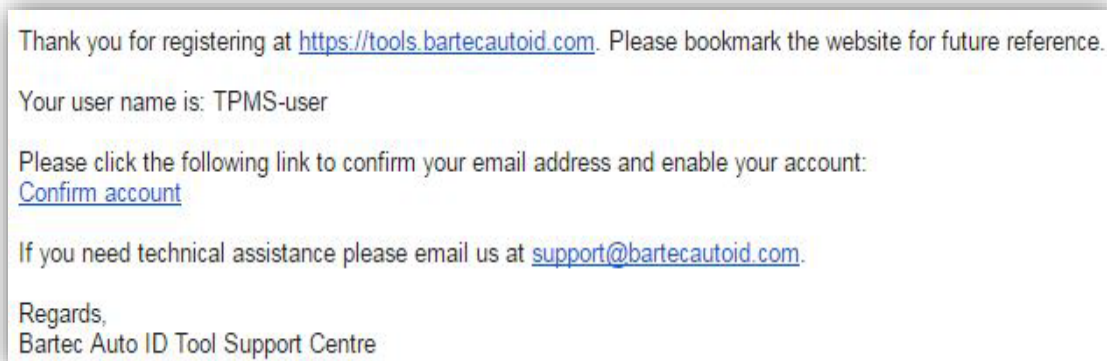

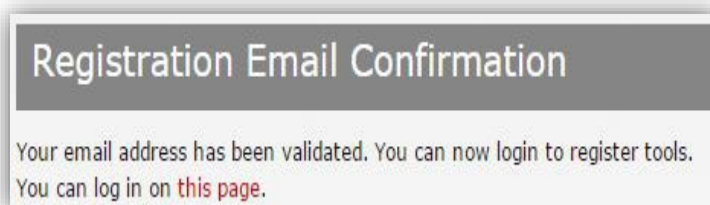

When clicking 'Confirm account' this will navigate to the website and the following page will indicate that the registration was successful. Return to the TPMS Desktop to login.



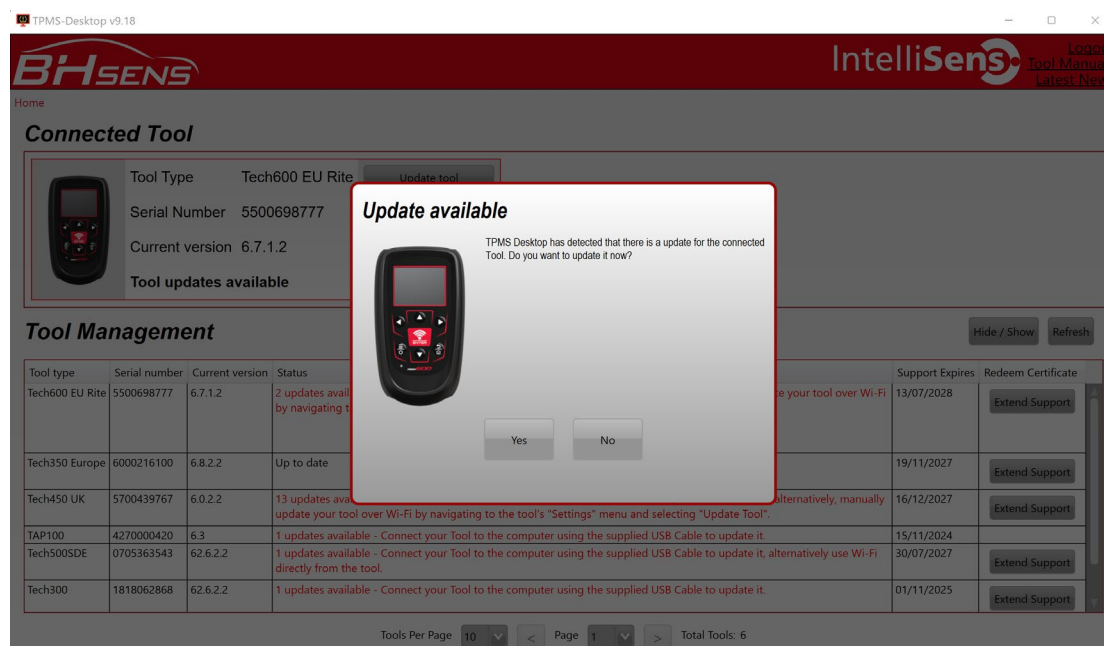

After login, the main screen of the TPMS Desktop is displayed.



Connect the BT600HD to the computer using the supplied USB cable. The TPMS Desktop will automatically register the tool and will display the message: “Tool successfully registered”.

The TPMS Desktop will then check for any updates that can be applied to the tool. Alternatively, select ‘Update’ to view all registered tools and their update status.



Whilst updating the BT600HD please keep the USB cable connected.

DISCONNECTING FROM PC

Before disconnecting the tool from a PC, please ensure to “safely remove hardware” first, by locating the “Safely Remove Hardware” icon on the lower right-hand side of the PC screen. This will prevent the data on the tool from being corrupted.

CONNECTING TO WIFI

Select connections in the settings menu, followed by Wi-Fi: Join Network. Select the correct network and enter the password.

Connecting to Wi-Fi is important to get automatic software updates. This is the preferred method of updating to ensure the tool will always have support available for the latest vehicles.

Updating the tool can also be done manually once it is connected to Wi-Fi. To do this go to 'Update Tool' in the settings menu and press enter.

Selecting Wi-Fi again displays information on the network the tool is connected to and allows that network to be removed by pressing 'Forget', allowing connection to a different network.

BT OBDII MODULE

The BT OBDII Module is a wireless communication interface that allows the tool to communicate with the vehicle to read diagnostic information that will aid in repairing TPMS faults and to also perform necessary TPMS relearns when a sensor has been replaced.

CONNECTING TO THE OBDII MODULE

Connect the BT OBDII Module to a vehicle's OBD port. Select connections in the settings menu, followed by BT OBDII Module: Add device. The tool will then search for the BT OBDII Module using the built in Bluetooth.

UPDATING THE OBDII MODULE

During a tool update it may be necessary to also update the BT OBDII Module. If an update for the Bluetooth OBDII Module is required, the following screen will be displayed:

Connect the OBDII Module to OBD II
Port and turn ignition ON.

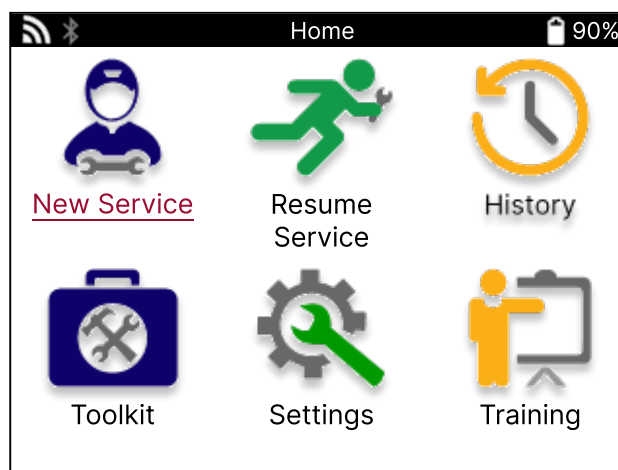
Press Enter to connect and
Update the OBDII Module.
Press Back to skip the update.

Connect the OBDII Module to a vehicle and set the ignition to 'On'. Do not start the engine. Press 'Enter' to connect the tool to the BT OBDII Module and proceed with the update and follow the onscreen prompts.

During the update, do not disconnect the BT OBDII Module from the vehicle, turn off the BT600HD, or otherwise stop the installation of the update until instructed to do so.

When instructed, disconnect the OBDII Module from the vehicle. The BT600HD will display an "installation complete" screen. The BT OBDII Module is now updated.

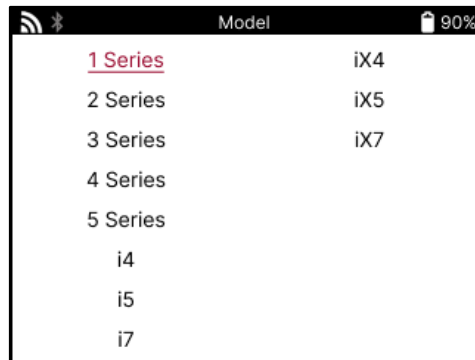
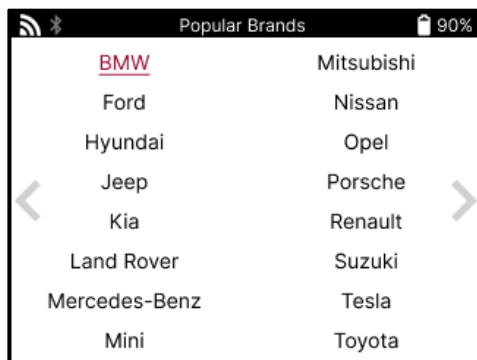
HOME MENU



	New Service Used to start a new service, for example: diagnose and repair TPMS issues, read DTCs and measure tyre tread depths.
	Resume Service Used to resume the last service.
	History Used to call up all stored services, searching by either registration or model. This function can also be used to upload and clear service data.
	Toolkit Used to identify a sensor type or aftermarket brand, scan for all known frequencies (RKE Test) or detect and display UHF signals (UHF monitor).
	Settings Used to set up preferences in the tool – Language, Wi-Fi/Bluetooth, units, auto – off, sound, etc.
	Training Used to get tips related to TPMS.

NEW SERVICE

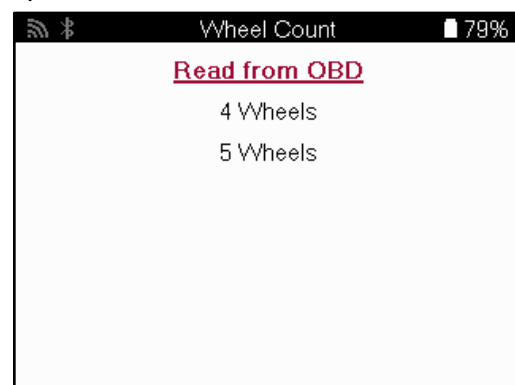
When starting a New Service, firstly select the vehicle that requires TPMS maintenance. Scroll through the menus to select the correct manufacturer, model, and year to see all available service functions.



SYSTEMS WITH 4 OR 5 WHEELS

Some TPMS Systems may be optionally equipped with 4 or 5 sensors.

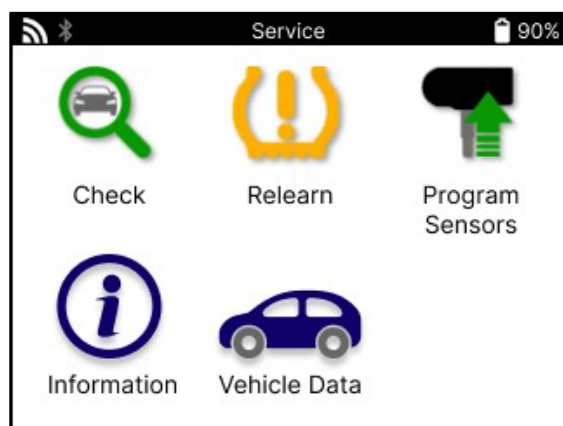
For such vehicles, after making the MMY selection a further menu will be displayed to select 4 or 5 wheels as appropriate. If the number of wheels equipped with sensors is unknown, the option to read the wheel count from the OBD is provided.



After selection all subsequent services will be configured with the selected wheel count.

SERVICE MENU

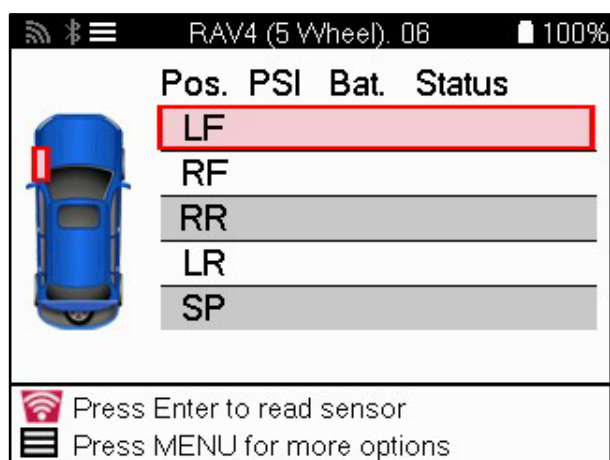
After selecting the vehicle, all the available options for the preselected MMY will be displayed. These functions will differ depending on the vehicle and whether the TPMS system is direct or indirect.



	Check The Check menu hosts additional sub menus: Check sensors, OBD Diagnostics and Wheel & Tyre as described below.
	Check Sensors Used to read sensors, including battery status and IDs and to help identify and diagnose sensor issues.
	OBD Diagnostics Used to help diagnose vehicle problems, read programmed sensor IDs, and read the vehicle VIN.
	Wheel & Tyre Used to input and record tyre tread measurements.
	Relearn Used to pair new sensors to the vehicle's TPM System.
	Program Sensor Used to program aftermarket sensors.
	Technical Information This lists detailed sensor and vehicle information as well as service tips.
	Vehicle Data Used to review all the recorded service data.

CHECK SENSORS

Check Sensors is located within the Check function of the Service menu if the vehicle is a direct TPM system. Use this service to read the installed sensors before continuing with further steps.



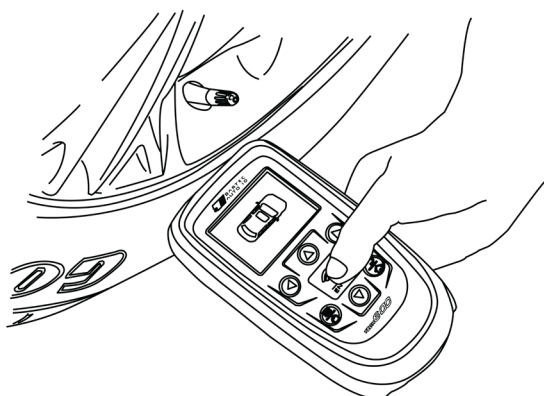
TIP:



If this icon is displayed on the screen press the Menu key for more options.

It is recommended to read all the sensors. The arrow keys can be used to select each sensor.

To test a sensor the tool should be placed against the tyre sidewall beneath the valve stem and not touching the metal rim as shown below. With the tool positioned correctly, press the 'Test' key to start the reading process.



The time it takes to read a sensor will vary depending upon the sensor brand. The tool will display a progress bar that depicts the maximum possible time the sensor may take.

Note: Some sensors require a rapid pressure drop of around 0.5 bar/10psi to activate them, the tool will indicate when this should be performed.

After reading a sensor, the tool will display the data read back from the sensor, this will include the pressure reading, battery life and condition and also the sensor status. The most common states are listed below:

	Successful Sensor Read The sensor is operating correctly.
	Failed Sensor Read The sensor failed to read. This could be a result of a sensor that is no longer functional due to a flat battery or could be an incorrectly installed sensor. In some cases, the sensor may have simply failed to activate so a second or third read attempt may be advised, especially if other sensors on the vehicle show the same result. If aftermarket sensors have recently been installed, ensure that they were programmed.
	Duplicate ID Two or more sensors have been read with the same sensor ID. Check there are no additional sensors located about the car or person and re-read all positions marked as a duplicate. If a newly programmed aftermarket sensor has been installed, check that it was not programmed with the same ID as one currently installed on the vehicle.
	Wrong Sensor Type A sensor has been identified but it is not compatible with the vehicle. If it is an aftermarket sensor then it can be programmed to the vehicle.
	Low Sensor Battery The sensor battery is almost flat, replace the sensor.

For a full list of all sensor states and their associated icons see appendix F.

If a sensor has been replaced without cloning, some method of relearn procedure may need to be followed, as explained in the Relearn section of the manual.

BATTERY LIFE

For some vehicles the tool is capable of calculating the remaining battery life of the sensor. This allows for upcoming issues to be identified early to avoid revisits for the same vehicle. When battery life is supported, an additional column will be displayed on the screen. The battery life will be displayed as either percentage or months remaining depending on the preselected vehicle.

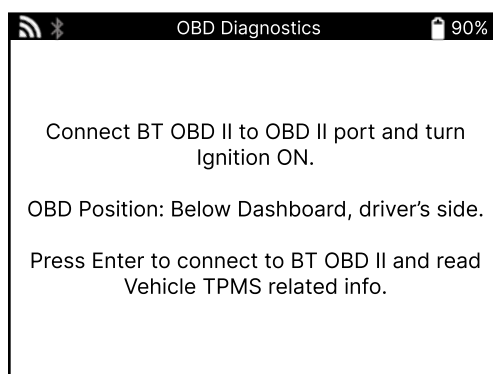

OBD DIAGNOSTICS

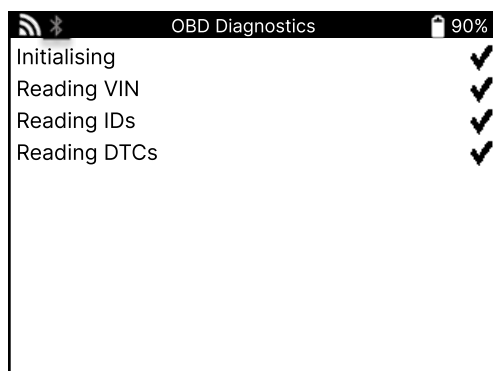
OBD Diagnostics is located within the Check function of the Service menu.

OBD Diagnostics reads information from the vehicle such as the VIN, Diagnostic Trouble Codes (DTCs), and the IDs of the sensors.

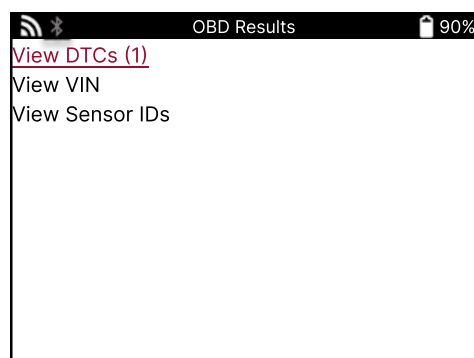
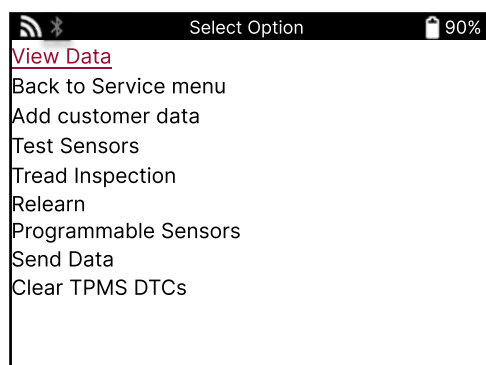
To read the OBD Diagnostics, select OBD Diagnostics. The tool will prompt to connect the BT OBDII Module to the vehicle's OBDII and to turn the ignition on, as shown below. The prompt will also indicate where the OBDII port is located on the vehicle.



When ready, press enter to begin the read process. The tool will list all of the data that is being read from the vehicle. In some cases, not all vehicles will support all of the data, and this may be indicated by a cross.



Once the read process completes, select View Data to view the information that was read from the vehicle.

DTCs are grouped into Current DTCs and Historic DTCs, use the left and right keys to select between the two. DTCs are listed with the DTC Code and the Failure Type Byte (FTB) along with a description (if supported).

If many DTCs are listed, the list can be scrolled up and down using the up and down keys. To see a longer description of the selected DTC, press the Enter key.

VIEW VIN:

The VIN is the 17-digit vehicle identification number, this is simply displayed on screen after making the View VIN selection.

VIEW SENSOR IDS:

The programmed Sensors IDs are listed along with the wheel location. The format of the IDs may be listed in either Hexadecimal or Decimal based upon the vehicle selection.

DISCONNECTING FROM THE OBDII MODULE

After using the OBDII Module please remove it from the vehicle. If the OBDII Module is left for a period without any activity or falls out of Bluetooth range, it will emit an audible alarm to prevent loss.

WHEEL & TYRE

Wheel & Tyre is located within the Check function of the Service menu. Use this service to input the tyre tread measurements.

To enter tyre tread depths, select the Wheel & Tyre option, followed by the tyre type: All season, summer, or winter.

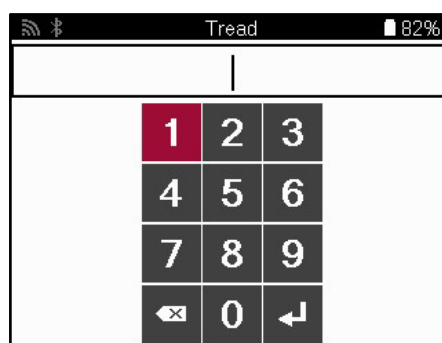
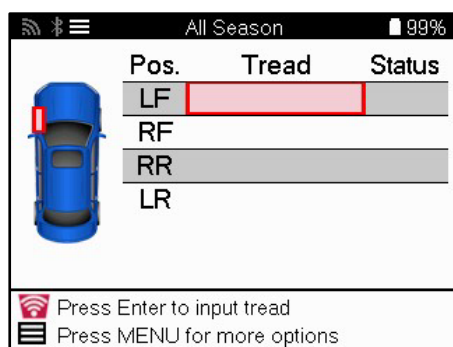
After selecting the Wheel & Tyre service, the selected wheel and tread position will be highlighted on the display.

Press the enter key to enter the tread measurement manually, the valid input range is 0-25mm.

Repeat this for each wheel and position: outer, centre and inner if using 3 tread measurements.

This can also be performed by using a TDR100BLE Tool.

The number of tread measurements to input can be changed from 1 to 3, with 3 being the default. The number of readings and the measurements can be configured in the Tread Settings.



The numbers will appear in different colours depending on measurement, as shown below:

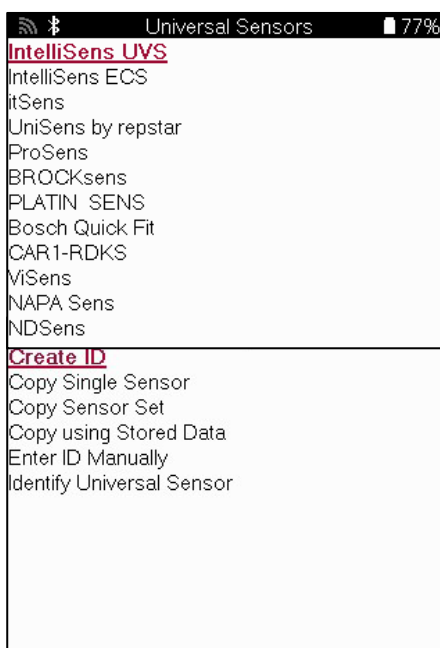
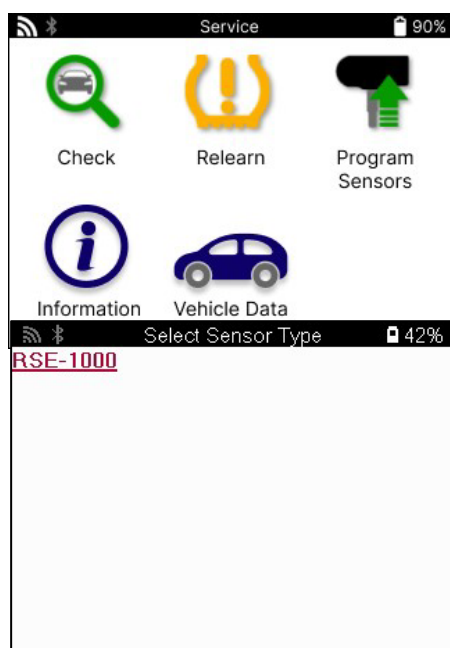

PROGRAMMABLE SENSOR

The "Program Sensors" function in the service menu allows you to program BH SENS IntelliSens universal aftermarket sensors. Even if they are already mounted in a wheel or programmed for another vehicle. A multi-brand upgrade is available as an option to program additional aftermarket universal sensors.

Choose from a selection of sensors that match the preselected MMY.



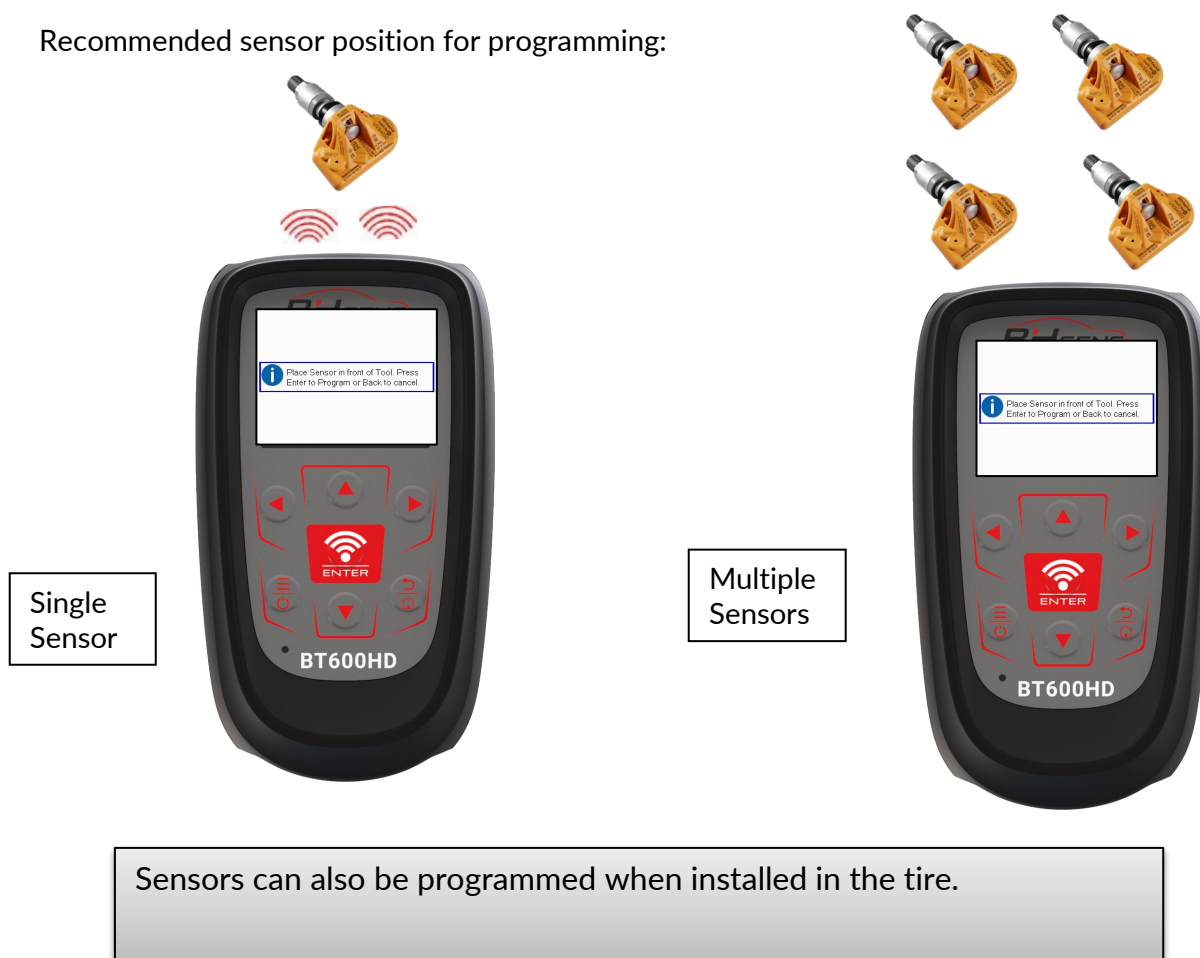
Create ID	Used to create a single sensor with a new ID. Can be repeated as many times as requested. The ID needs to be relearned to the vehicle's ECU. The following pages will describe this procedure.
Copy Single Sensor	Used to copy a single sensor.
Copy Sensor Set	Used to copy/clone e.g. a winter tyre set with the same ID's as the summer tyre set. Requires the reading of the old sensor to program the same ID on the replacement sensor to avoid the relearning process.
Copy Using Stored Data	Used to store IDs either read from the TPMS sensors or from the vehicle OBD
Enter ID Manually	Used to create a sensor with a new ID that can be typed in manually. This option only appears for some sensors. If it is not possible to copy the ID, enter the same ID manually, which is written on the sensor's body.
Multiprogramming	Used to program 4 sensors at a time or 5 sensors for specific vehicles. This function is not available on all sensors.
Identify Universal Sensor	Used to identify the type of universal sensor placed in front of the tool.

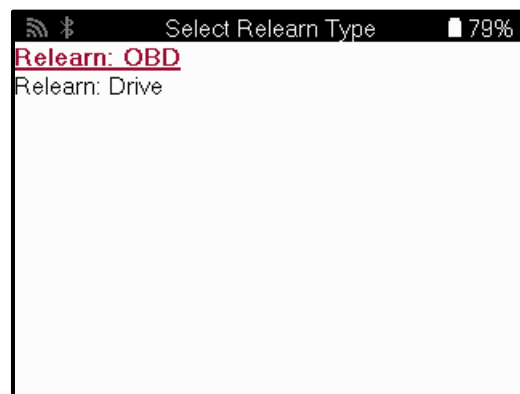
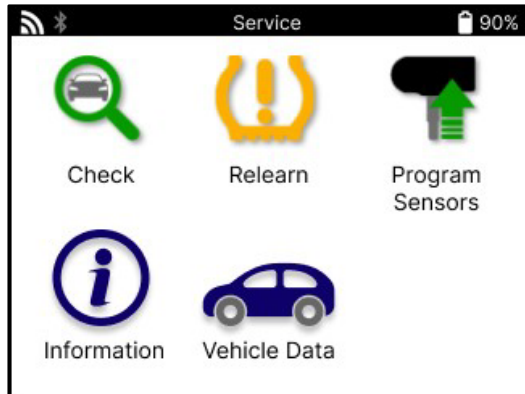
This gives the option to either create or copy the ID.

Notice: Sensors need to be read before copying Single Sensor/Sensor Set.

Recommended sensor position for programming:



RELEARN



To find out which relearn type is available for a vehicle, just turn on the tool and select Relearn.

Relearn is used to pair new sensors to the vehicle.

Select one of the following relearn methods and follow the instructions given by the tool to relearn sensors.

STATIONARY RELEARNS

Stationary relearns use the vehicle's onboard TPMS system to listen for transmissions from sensors while the vehicle is in a "Learn Mode".

Once the vehicle is in Learn Mode, use the tool to activate the sensors. The vehicle will listen for the sensor IDs and relearn them to the vehicle.

ACTIVE (DRIVE) RELEARNS

Some vehicles can be reset by driving. Refer to the on-screen relearn procedures for details on how far/long to drive. It can take up to 20 minutes to relearn the sensor IDs.

OBD RELEARNS

If the preselected vehicle is supported, relearn allows the BT600HD to directly program the vehicle's ECU with sensor IDs.

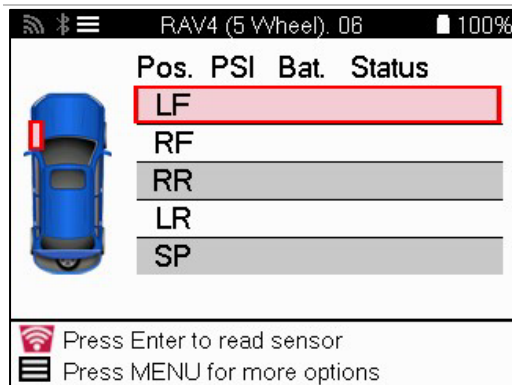
OBD can be connected when all sensors have been successfully read and the message "All Sensors OK" is displayed.

RELEARN INFORMATION

This contains extra information about the relearn for the selected vehicle, which can assist with any problems. An example would be for some Toyota and Lexus vehicles which use a summer and winter tyre set.

RELEARN COMPLETION

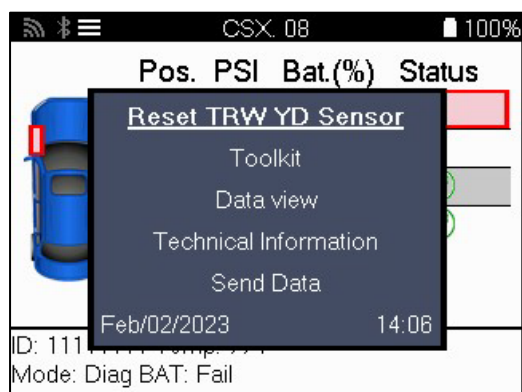
On some vehicles, after performing a relearn the TPMS light stays on. In this case finalisation is required to turn the TPMS light off. This often involves re-reading the sensors, again the tool will provide specific instructions to follow in order to turn the light off.



As well as the pressure and temperature, we also display the “mode” of the sensor. In some cases, the mode cannot be changed and isn’t important, but in some cases, it will need to be changed in order for the relearn to work.

For example, if sensors for a vehicle show “Park” or “Drive” they are already in the correct mode. Otherwise, use the “Mode Change” command in the Quick Access Menu. If the sensors are shown as Ship, Off, or Test mode, put them in Park mode, using the “Mode Change” command in the Quick Access Menu.

Press the Quick Menu and see the options available for the vehicle requiring a relearn. Options that are not required on a vehicle will not be displayed.



Special service advice for Toyota Models:

Toyota ECU Reset

If at any time the vehicle TPMS Reset button is pressed with the new sensor IDs fitted, the ECU OBD relearn will not work until the Toyota ECU Reset is selected (with the tool connected to OBD). The TPMS Reset button should only be used to set new tyre pressures, and on some vehicles to change between winter and summer ID sets.

Special service advice for Kia and Hyundai Models:

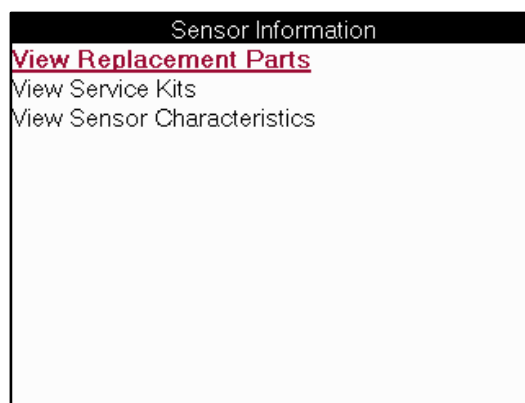
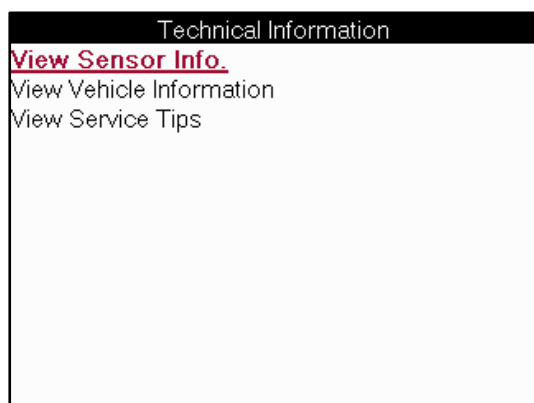
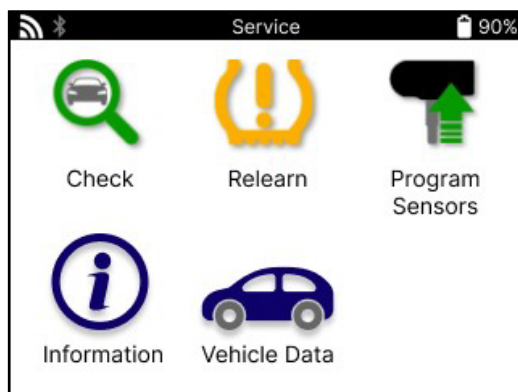
Reset YD Sensor

For some Kia and Hyundai vehicles with the newer low line TRW YD sensors, this allows the sensors to be put back into the correct mode (Sleep or Rest) to work with the vehicle.

This specific service advice will only appear if applicable for the preselected Make, Model, and Year combination.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Gives detailed information about replacement parts, service kits, sensors, vehicles, and service tips.

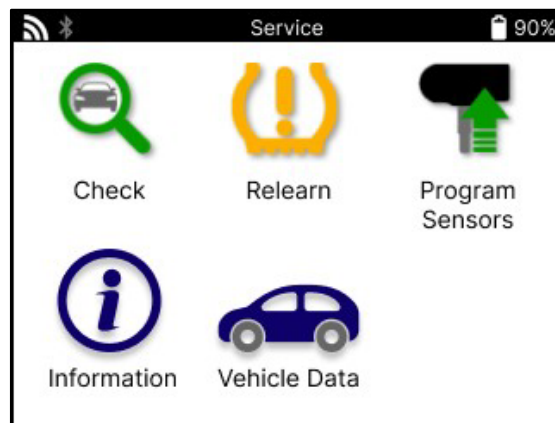


Sensors do not have to be read to access the following information.

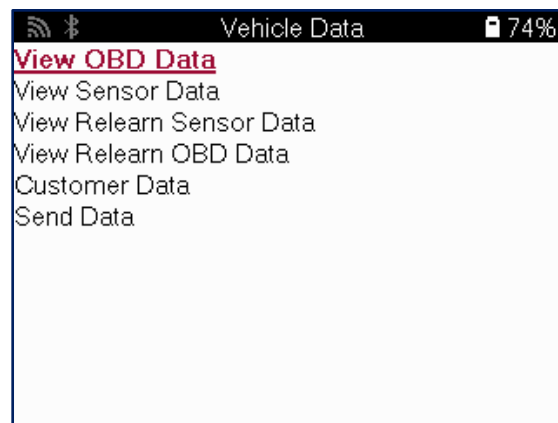
View Replacement Parts	Used to show all replacement sensor part numbers that can be fitted to the preselected MMY.
View Service Kits	Used to show all replacement service kit part numbers that can be fitted to the preselected MMY.
View Sensor Characteristics	Used to show technical sensor information of the sensor that needs to be fitted. e.g., Nut torque settings.
View Vehicle Information	Used to provide information about the relearn method, the OBD port location, and if there are programmable sensors for the preselected MMY available.
View Service Tips	Used to provide information about the specific meaning of the TPMS light as well as common mechanical faults for the preselected MMY.

VEHICLE DATA

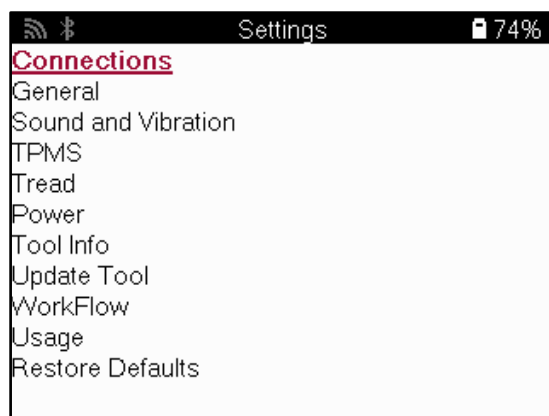
Sensors and OBD need to have been read for data to be shown.



The Vehicle Data gives direct access to screens that display the Vehicle Data. This makes it convenient to check all sensor and OBD data. It also contains customer data and gives the option of sending data.

Make the vehicle selection using the MMY selection in New Service, followed by the number of axles and the wheel configuration.



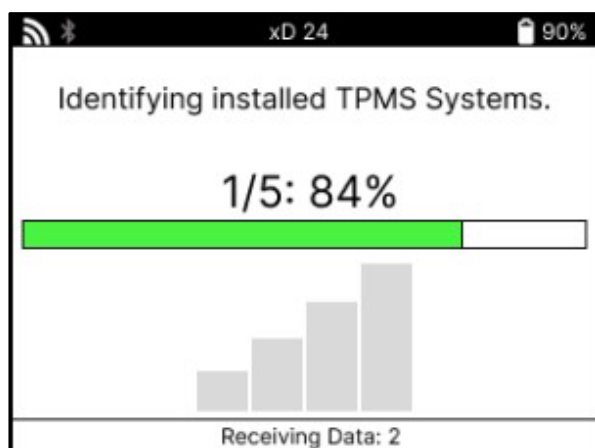

COMMERCIAL VEHICLE SCAN

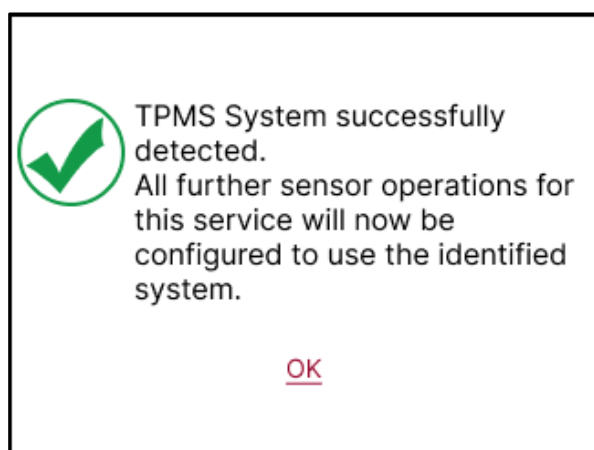
Some older commercial vehicles may be fitted with any number of unidentifiable aftermarket TPM Systems. The commercial vehicle scan solves this using the identify scan.

After the vehicle is selected, using the coverage, it will determine the TPM System by searching all retrofit sensors and identify the system installed. Following this all subsequent searches will be calibrated to the identified system.

Select scan sensor to start the identifying scan. This shows that the TPMS system is being identified. The tool will also display a progress bar that depicts the maximum possible time the scan may take.



When the search has completed, the tool will state that it has been successful in identifying the system. After closing the dialog, the service screen will be displayed and the tool will now configure itself for the identified aftermarket sensor type, including Check, Relearn, Program and Information.

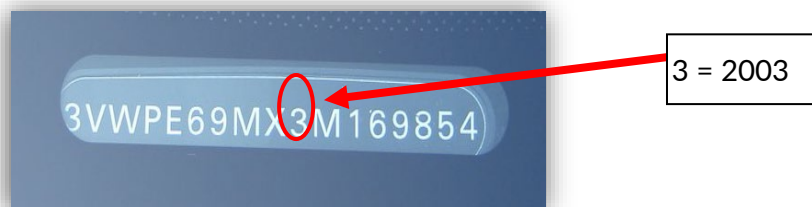

APPENDIX A: Vehicle Identification Number (VIN)

When using the BT600HD tool, it is important to verify the Model Year to help insure looking for that proper sensor and using the proper vehicle COMs when necessary.

By using the vehicle's VIN and locating the 10th digit from the left it is possible in most cases accurately determine the vehicle's Model Year. Take that digit and reference the chart on this sheet. This will be the Model Year that needs to be selected on the tool.

APPENDIX B: TPMS SYSTEM REVIEW



When cycling the ignition for off to run, the TPMS tell-tale should come on, and go off. This would indicate a system with no fault present.

Solid Light: Pressure Problem

Check the tyre pressures and adjust to the placard.
NOTE: Some vehicles are equipped with sensors in the spare. Also, with some vehicles, overpressure may turn on the light.

Flashing Light: System Problem

System problems can range from faulty sensor(s) to sensors on the vehicle that haven't been learned to that vehicle.

APPENDIX C: MODES and MODE CHANGING

Sensors can have many different “modes” when they have been read, such as Learn, Tool LF, YD Sleep, YD Rest, Hi Norm Dly. Some of those are called sleep mode to preserve battery life.

Mostly, these modes are not important because the sensor will be supplied already in the correct mode to use. But for some sensors made by Continental, it is important that the mode is displayed as “Park”, as otherwise, it will not work on the vehicle.

The BT600HD tool has the ability to perform the necessary mode change. If a sensor is shown as “Ship”, “Test” or “Off” and the relearn toolkit provides the option “Set Sensor to Park Mode”, please use this option to change the sensor mode into the correct one:

- Go to “Relearn” and select the vehicle (MMY).
- Press enter when relearn procedure shows.
- Select the spanner in the upper left corner with the Up/Down buttons. Press Enter.
- Select “Set Sensor to Park Mode”, and press Enter.
- Go to the wheel, hold the tool near the sensor, and press “Test”.
- Repeat for each wheel.
- Start the Relearn procedure.

Also, some sensors are supplied in a mode where they cannot be read by the tool unless they are pressurized in a wheel. Some examples would be replacement sensors bought from a Ford dealership, and some Mitsubishi Continental sensors.

APPENDIX D: COMMS ERROR TROUBLESHOOTING

If a problem or error occurs during the COMMS process, follow the steps below before calling customer support.

Check vehicle ignition.

Vehicle ignition must be in the RUN position for the vehicle COMMS process to complete.

Check the cable to tool connection.

Ensure the cable is connected at the DB15 and thumb screws are finger tight.

Check the cable connection at the vehicle.

Make sure the BT OBDII Module connection is good.

Verify Make, Model, and Year.

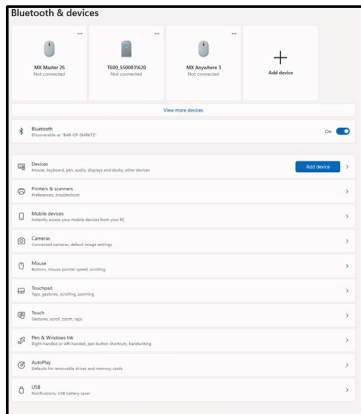
COMMS can change from Model to Model and Year to Year. Verify the tool is set up to the proper MMY.

Verify tool power level.

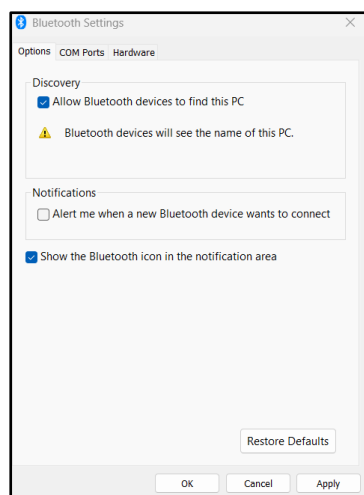
If the tool has a low battery charge, this may affect the COMMS process. Charge the tool and try again.

APPENDIX E: CONNECTING TO TPMS DESKTOP USING BLUETOOTH

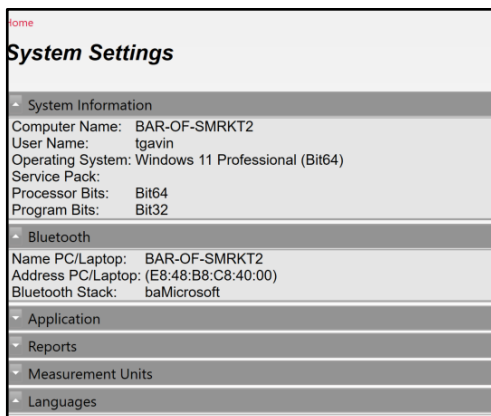
If there are problems using the built-in Bluetooth, use a Bluetooth USB dongle. Select Bluetooth and Devices in settings, followed by View more devices.



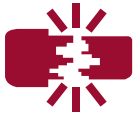
The following screen will be found under more Bluetooth settings. Tick the boxes as seen on the Options tab. Press OK when finished.



Start the TPMS Desktop application and go to Settings. Open the Bluetooth section and take note of the PC/Laptop name. Using the BT600HD, scan for the PC/Laptop name shown and select it for connection, following the on screen prompts of the tool.



APPENDIX F: SENSOR STATES AND DEFINITIONS

	Failed Sensor Read The sensor failed to read. This could be a result of a sensor that is no longer functional due to a flat battery or could be an incorrectly installed sensor. In some cases, the sensor may have simply failed to activate so a second or third read attempt may be advised, especially if other sensors on the vehicle show the same result. If aftermarket sensors have recently been installed, ensure that they were programmed
	Defective sensor The sensor has a hardware fault, check that it is not over pressurized or overheated. If the problem cannot be resolved the sensor should be replaced.
	Duplicate ID Two or more sensors have been read with the same sensor ID. Check there are no additional sensors located about the car or person and re-read all positions marked as a duplicate. If a newly programmed aftermarket sensor has been installed, check that it was not programmed with the same ID as one currently installed on the vehicle.
	Mechanically broken By pressing the quick menu, it is possible to manually record the sensor as having mechanical damage such as corroded or snapped stem. Replace the faulty components where possible or if not replace the sensor.
	Wrong Sensor Type A sensor has been identified but it is not compatible with the vehicle. If it is an aftermarket sensor then it can be programmed to the vehicle.
	New sensor The installed sensor has an Id that has not been programmed into the vehicle's ECU, a relearn is required.
NP	No Pressure The sensor is overpressurised but has not reported a hardware fault, check the pressure and ensure that the sensor meets the requirements of the vehicle.
	Rotated The sensor is installed in a wheel position that differs to the location it has been programmed to in the ECU. If the vehicle is not auto-locating, a relearn should be performed to program the ID into the correct location.
	Depleting Battery The sensor battery is low, it is recommended to replace the sensor.

	Incorrect mode The sensor is in the incorrect mode of operation for the vehicle. Use the Menu key to place the sensor into the correct mode.
	Success The sensor is operating correctly.
